do i dare disturb the universe this is a question recognized by people around the world if typed into the internet hundreds of examples appear many know that it comes from one of the best known poems of the previous century t s eliot s the love song of j alfred prufrock what many do not know is that eliot dramatically shifted his views at the height of his fame for writing such dark poetry as this and the waste land becoming a sincere devoted christian while his poetry is famous because it expresses the loss of a spiritual center in european civilization a careful reading of it reveals that he was struggling with his christianity from the beginning not rejecting it but trying to make it fit into the contemporary world if the reader works through eliot s love song for all of the esoteric meanings as he demands it quickly becomes evident that he intended it as a struggle between agape amour and eros beginning it with a quote from dante forces that into place though the protestant forms of christianity have changed their views on these the roman catholic holds fast eliot references michelangelo in the poem bringing in the great painter of the ceiling of the sistine chapel most immediately recognize his name and work but do not realize how he expressed a similar personal struggle between the desires of the flesh and the spirit both of them admired dante s divine comedy and its inclusion of amour as a means to

salvation dante s work is generally seen as the greatest literature ever to come out of italy this book is an expanded revision of seeking god in the works of t s eliot and michelangelo it explores how t s eliot struggled with the highest meanings of existence in his poetry and his own life and perhaps managed to express what has become known as a modernist and post modernist view of what rudolph otto designated the mysterium tremendum the experience of a mystical awe the experience of god

although we have the complete works of two major socratic writers plato and xenophon little work has been done to bring them into relation with each other other than investigating them as sources for the historical socrates today an emerging consensus holds that neither author aimed at historical veracity and that the portraits of socrates primarily express the views of their authors this book analyzes the behavior of socrates and other characters in the two symposia through the lens of the social virtues discussed by aristotle in his nichomachean ethics friendliness truthfulness in self presentation and good humor starting with the prologues to the two symposia and republic which is closely related to them the book sketches a portrait of socrates as a social creature it focuses on socratic boasting in plato s symposium and socratic joking in xenophon s symposium highlighting the virtuosity of socrates social techniques and showing how he presses the limits of good behavior in both his self presentation and his use of humor the book concludes that this was a feature of the historical socrates and that it inspired plato and xenophon to conceive of virtue in characteristically different ways

traditional plato scholarship in the english speaking world has assumed that platonic dialogues are merely collections of arguments inevitably the question arises if plato wanted to present collections of arguments why did he write dialogues instead of treatises concerned about this question some scholars have been experimenting with other more contextualized ways of reading the dialogues this anthology is among the first to present these new approaches as pursued by a variety of scholars as such it offers new perspectives on plato as well as a suggestive view of plato scholarship as something of a laboratory for historians of philosophy generally the essays gathered here each examine vital aspects of plato s many methods considering his dialogues in relation to thucydides and homer narrative strategies and medical practice images and metaphors they offer surprising new research into such much studied works as the republic as well as revealing views of lesser known dialogues like the cratylus and philebus with reference to thinkers such as heidegger gadamer and sartre the authors place the platonic dialogues in an illuminating historical context together their essays
